

# SUSTAINABLE TOURISM GUIDELINES

# Do's and Don'ts When Visiting Nature & Cultural Heritage Sites

Responsible tourism contributes to the protection of natural environments, the preservation of cultural heritage, and the well-being of local communities. Please follow the guidelines below to ensure a respectful, safe, and sustainable travel experience.

## 1. Respect for Nature & Wildlife

#### ✓ Do:

- Stay on designated trails and comply with site signage.
- Observe wildlife quietly; use binoculars when needed.
- Dispose of waste responsibly.
- Support conservation through official entrance or conservation fees.

# X Don't:

- Feed, touch, or disturb wildlife.
- Remove natural materials as souvenirs.
- Use loud audio, drones, or flash photography near wildlife.
- Discard waste or cigarette butts in natural areas.

#### 2. Protection of Cultural & Heritage Sites

#### ✓ Do:

- Respect cultural norms, dress codes, and religious protocols.
- Follow instructions from guides and site authorities.
- Request permission before photographing people or ceremonies.
- Support local artisans by purchasing authentic products.
- Use certified local guides for accurate information.

#### X Don't:

- Touch, lean on, or climb heritage structures.
- Write, carve, or leave markings on any surface.
- Enter restricted or sacred zones without approval.
- Buy, sell, or trade cultural artifacts or wildlife products.





## 3. Respect Local Communities & Act Sustainably

#### ✓ Do:

- Engage politely with locals and learn basic local phrases.
- Prioritize local service providers.
- Adhere to "Leave No Trace" principles.
- Participate in community or environmental initiatives when possible.

## X Don't:

- Interrupt cultural or religious activities.
- Give gifts or money directly to children; support recognized charities instead.
- Engage in any inappropriate interactions with children.
- Demand imported or non-local goods.
- Participate in exploitative wildlife tourism (e.g., elephant rides, forced animal photos).

# 4. Safety & Compliance

#### ✓ Do:

- Follow all safety regulations and local laws.
- Pay attention to safety briefings from guides.
- Familiarize yourself with emergency contacts.

# X Don't:

- Ignore warnings related to terrain, wildlife, or weather.
- Confront or argue with officers enforcing site rules.
